What is a Safety Culture?

- Attitudes
- Beliefs
- Perceptions
- Values

In other words, “the way we do safety around here”.

Safety Culture

A broken safety culture has been responsible for many of the major process safety disasters that have taken place around the world for the past 20 years or longer.

- Space Shuttle Challenger
- Chernobyl Disaster

Safety Culture is expressed through behaviors and activities.

Individual Safety Attitudes Develop and Persist in Response to Each of us

Who Do You Influence?

What Does a Good Safety Culture Look Like?

'Safety Management' factors	Cultural/social factors
Delegation of safety activities	(more general) empowerment of the workforce
Conduct of safety audits	Good relations between management and workers
Monitoring of unsafe worker behaviors	Encouragement of a long-term commitment of the work force
Safety training - initial and continuing	Low turnover and longer seniority
Good housekeeping	Active role of top management
