Celebrating Multiple Identities: Looking for Similarities, Building on Differences

Dr. Worrell will draw on his research and professional experiences to showcase two things: (a) there is incredible diversity within all groups, and (b) there are remarkable similarities across all groups. He will touch on issues of belonging and identity, especially as they relate to an individual's status as a member of a minority group or a member of the majority group, and highlight the need for open and respectful communication in diverse societies.

Frank C. Worrell received his PhD in Educational and School Psychology at the University of California, Berkeley. His research interests include academic talent recruitment, at-risk youth, cultural identities, scale development and validation, teacher effectiveness, and the translation of research findings into school-based practice. Dr. Worrell is a member of the editorial boards of several journals, and is currently co-Editor of Review of Educational Research. In 2011, Dr. Worrell was honored with the Chancellor's Award for Advancing Institutional Excellence in research, teaching, and service at the University of California, Berkeley. He received a Presidential Award from the National Association for School Psychologists in 2009 and a Presidential Citation from the American Psychological Association in 2011. Dr. Worrell has ongoing research collaborations in Chile, Germany, Italy, New Zealand, Nigeria, and Peru.
